April Dates in Marine Corps History From Jr Vice Commandant Marty DeVasier

- **3** April 1945: On Okinawa, Marines of the III Amphibious Corps by this date (d+2) made progress clearing the island effectively cutting it in two. They reached their objective originally thought to require 11 days to take.
- 10 April 1959: Lt. Col. John Glenn, Jr. was named one of the original seven Project Mercury astronauts selected for space training. Three years later Col. Glenn became the first American to orbit the Earth.
- **12-13 April 1918:** Marines of the 4th Brigade suffered their first gas attack when the Germans bombarded the 74th Company, 6th Marines near Verdun with mustard gas. Three hundred Marines were gassed and evacuated. Thirty Marines died from the shelling that hit while they were asleep.
- **15 April 1962:** Marine Corps operational involvement in the Vietnam War began HMM 362 arrived at Soc Trang south of Saigon. The task unit was called "Shufly" and its first operational employment lifting Vietnamese troops into battle.
- **18 April 1983:** One Marine Security Guard was killed and seven wounded by a car bomb outside the Embassy in Beirut, Lebanon. The explosion killed 61 people including 17 Americans
- 21 April 1951: Marine carrier-based airplanes made their first aerial contact with enemy planes in Korea. Three YAK Fighters were shot down and another damaged in the heavily defended Pyongyang-Chinnanpo area. The pilots were with VMF 312 flying from the USS Bataan.
- **28 April 1993:** Marine All-Weather Attack Squadron 332 transferred the last Marine A-6E to St. Augustine, Florida and prepared for the transition to the F/A-18D and eventual movement from Cherry Point to Beauport, South Carolina.
