Farewell, John Glenn

Last month, on December 8, we bid farewell to John Glenn, a Marine fighter pilot who flew combat missions during World War II and the Korean War. Later he was a test pilot who set a transcontinental speed record. We remember him especially as a pioneering astronaut who was a member of the original team of 7 Mercury Astronauts. Later, at age 77, he flew in the shuttle Discovery and became the oldest human to go into space. Finally, he served 24 years as a United States Senator. His life and achievements are an inspiration to the world. All Americans can admire his lifetime of service to our country. To the Marines we are proud to have him as a brother.

I have long felt a certain connection to John Glenn, not that he was aware of it. On February 20 1962 he was the first American to go into orbit around the Earth. As Glenn was making his journey I was in Grand Central Station with a buddy who was in my platoon at Parris Island. We were waiting for our connections, watching a television report of Glenn's progress. A man from a newspaper saw the two of us in our dress greens and took a picture of us watching the event.

It was my first day off base since reporting for active duty. It was also the first time I saw my family's new home in New Hampshire. John Glenn's flight makes it easy for me to remember the date.
