

But We're Still the Marines

Attention on deck! The few and the proud are in the process of becoming the fewer and the prouder. A recent article in the Washington Post highlights changes in the makeup and mindset of our beloved Marine Corps that Gen. David Berger, commandant, began in 2019 (Opinion | The Marines are establishing a beachhead for needed change at the Pentagon - The Washington Post). He is working to modernize the way the Corps goes about its business, with a focus on being more nimble and better able to quickly respond to military challenges around the globe. To do this, new technology will be employed and new systems will be used that are small, elusive and sometimes unmanned.

We've heard this before, right? But Gen. Berger's vision for the Corps is prevailing against a hidebound bureaucracy to become reality. One result is that fewer Marines will be needed and they will be in smaller, quick-responding units in forward bases. The Second Marine Division at Camp Lejeune, for example, was reduced from 18,000 Marines to 15,000. It also gave up its bridging and engineering units and a sizable chunk of its tanks and armor in an effort to become more nimble.

Plans now call for creating littoral brigades that can operate quickly and stealthily, with many Marines replaced by unmanned systems — and using electronic-warfare tools that can hide their presence and find the enemy. "This is the biggest change in 70 years for the Marine Corps, but we're still the Marines," said Brig. Gen. Eric Austin, director of capabilities development at the Marine Corps Warfighting Laboratory at Quantico, Va.

The Marine Corps must evolve to survive. Gen. Berger's plan is intended to ensure that the Corps will not only carry on, but thrive. Change, even for a Marine Corps that reveres its past, is often difficult but eventually becomes necessary. Marines will embrace the new realities while honoring their heritage; and that's something that will never change
