About Us:

The Westfield River Valley, Detachment 141 and Auxiliary are located in Westfield, Massachusetts. The Detachment's Charter was signed on November 28, 1945. The Auxiliary unit received it's Charter on May 23, 1949, but was misplaced and on October 25, 1979 received their new Charter.

Fundraisers:

Did you know......

Dec. 1, 1925: The Locarno Treaties were signed by France, Belgium and Germany, as a preventive measure to avoid another war, in the aftermath of World War I. Terms of the Locarno Pact were guaranteed by Britain and Italy.

Dec. 2, 1859: Abolitionist leader John Brown was executed for treason in Charles Town, West Virginia, following his raid on the U.S. arsenal at Harper's Ferry.

Dec. 4, 1943: During World War II, the second Cairo Conference took place attended by Prime Minister Churchill, President Roosevelt and President Inonu of Turkey.

Dec. 7, 1941: The U.S. Naval base at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii was attacked by the Japanese in a raid that lasted just over an hour and killed 3,000 Americans.

Dec. 8, 1941: A day after the Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor, the United States and Britain declared war on Japan.

Dec. 10, 1941: During World War II, British battleships Repulse and Prince of Wales were sunk by Japanese warplanes in the South China Sea, killing nearly 800 crewmen.

Dec. 11, 1941: A major turning point in World War II occurred as Japan's Axis partners, Italy and Germany both declared war on the United States. The U.S. Congress immediately declared war on them. President Roosevelt then made the defeat of Hitler the top priority, devoting nearly 90 percent of U.S. military resources to the war in Europe.

Dec. 13, 1937: The beginning of one of the worst atrocities of World War II as the Chinese city of Nanking was captured by the Japanese. During the next six weeks, <u>The Rape of Nanking</u> occurred in which Japanese soldiers randomly attacked, raped and indiscriminately killed an estimated 200,000 Chinese.

Dec. 15, 1961: Nazi SS-Colonel Adolf Eichmann was sentenced to death in Jerusalem for his role in the Holocaust. Eichmann had organized the deportation of Jews from all over occupied Europe to Nazi death camps.

Dec. 16, 1944: The Battle of the Bulge began as the Germans launched a big counter-offensive in the Ardennes Forest along a 75-mile front, taking American troops by surprise. Aided by foggy, snowy weather, the Germans penetrated 65 miles into Allied lines by the end of December. The German advance was finally halted by General Montgomery at the Meuse and General Patton at Bastogne.

Dec. 18, 1916: During World War I, the Battle of Verdun concluded after 10 months of fighting in which 543,000 French and 434,000 German soldiers were killed.

Dec. 18, 1940: Adolph Hitler ordered the German General Staff to begin planning Operation Barbarossa, the invasion of Soviet Russia.

Dec. 19, 1946: War broke out in French Indochina as Ho Chi Minh attacked the French seeking to oust them from Vietnam. This marked the beginning of a 30-year conflict which eventually led to heavy U.S. involvement and ended with a Communist victory in April 1975 after U.S. withdrawal from South Vietnam.

Dec. 21, 1945: General George Patton died in Germany following a car accident. Nicknamed "Old Blood and Guts" he once stated during the war, "We shall attack and attack until we are exhausted, and then we shall attack again."

Dec. 23, 1948: Japanese Prime Minister Hideki Tojo was hanged for war crimes. He was hanged along with six other Japanese wartime military leaders at Sugamo Prison in Tokyo, with the sentence carried out by the U.S. 8th Army.

Dec. 24, 1942: The first surface-to-surface guided missile, later known as the V-1 Flying Bomb was launched by German rocket engineer Wernher Von Braun.

Dec. 29, 1940: During the Blitz, Germans dropped thousands of incendiary bombs on the center of London, causing the worst fire damage since the great fire of 1666.



Military Order of the Devil Dogs Pound #276, MA Pack

WHAT IT IS

The Military Order of Devil Dogs is the Fun and Honor Society of the Marine Corps League.

1. WHAT IT DOES

It promotes good fellowship amongst the members of different Marine Corps League Detachments. The Order provides amusement and entertainment at all gatherings of the League, when and where advisable. It assists in the accomplishment of all programs and objectives of the League, preserves and strengthens the principles and ideals of the League, and maintains true allegiance to the United States of America and its Constitution and laws. It fosters and extends American institutions of freedom and defends America against all enemies whatsoever. The Order is also VERY active in raising funds for different charities.

WHO BELONGS

The Military Order of the Devil Dogs is made up of only members of the Marine Corps League. The Order accepts only the most worthy of League members.

HOW TO JOIN

You must be a paid-up member and in good standing in the Marine Corps League with at least one year's membership. The applicant must be active in his or her Detachment in the League, and must request membership in the Order. He or she must be recommended by his or her Detachment Commandant and be sponsored by two Devil Dogs or Pedigreed Devil Dogs. The applicant is then interviewed by the members of the Pound at the Pound Growl. (A meeting is called a Growl.) If accepted, the applicant must undergo an initiation and swearing-in ceremony. Then he or she becomes a Pup in the Order.

ORGANIZATION

The Pound is on a local level and is usually made up of members of different Marine Corps League Detachments. On the State level there is the Pack, and on the National level there is a Kennel. There are three different degrees in the Order. The lowest degree is that of Pup. The next degree is that of Devil Dog. The highest degree is that of Pedigreed Devil Dog. The Pup wears a black ribbon, the Devil Dog wears a red ribbon, and the Pedigreed Devil Dog wears a gold ribbon. The ribbon is worn around the neck and a Dog Tag is attached to it.

The head of the Pound is called the Pound Keeper. The head of the pack is the Pack Leader. The head of the Kennel is also the head of all Devil Dogs and is called Chief Devil Dog.

The Order's many charitable donations not only help people in need, but also build good public relations for the Order, the League, and the United States Marine Corps.
