Minutes of Monthly Meeting 10 November 2025

OPENING CEREMONY: The Sergeant-at-Arms secured the quarters at 1903 hours, posted the Colors and led the detachment in the Pledge of Allegiance; the Chaplain read the opening prayer after which the Sergeant-at-Arms declared the meeting open for official business. Thirteen regular members, fourteen associate members and two guests were present.

INSTALLATION: Officers and appointed positions were sworn in from 19:03 to 19:11 by Fran Curnow.

Boyscout troop #114 for \$500 was asked to be added to the list (Chuck Distefano added this as amendment). This list is a year to year budget to budget decision not a yearly donation amount. We can donate more after repairs are made and paid for for the barracks. The total amount asked to disseminate out to all of the charities came to \$5,435. We voted for this package for community help. Motion was made by Dan Bishop and second by Joe Delaney and unanimously accepted to pay each of the following in amounts of \$250-\$500 per charity:

New Business:

The Mason's reached out to Ernie about the tree fair they are having. They wanted to know if we were interested in sponsoring a tree at the "Festival of trees" at the Big E. It will have our name and will help kids in need who need Christmas presents. We buy the tree and decorate and buy the presents for this event. Rob motions for the League to buy the tree and members to buy the presents. Joe motions for \$200 to buy the tree and make it a kids tree which needs kids presents bought by the members and brought to the detachment for Ernie to pick up. **Please have presents to the detachment for 11/17/2025.** The two motions are second by Dan Bishop and unanimously approved.
